NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – May 12, 2022

I he meeting was called to order at 6:07 PM by President Bob LaFlamme. The meeting was held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington, CT.

Bob asked for any corrections to the April meeting minutes as they appeared in the newsletter. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the April 2022 meeting minutes.

President's Report:

Bob LaFlamme welcomed the membership and thanked the members participating in and administering the building contest event taking place. Bob especially thanked Ed P- for running the event.

Bob reviewed with the membership the goals he laid out for 2022.

Vice President's Report:

Mike Maznicki reviewed the list of instructors and made updates. He then spoke about

several members and prospective members that need an instructor.

Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 192 members. There were 42 members and 5 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included Gene Paulson, Joan Liska, Darrell Vliegenthardt, John Messenger, and Ailene Lang.

Stan reported that member Gregg P- now has an active AMA membership and, as such, his flying privileges at the NCRCC field have been restored.

Stan gave a report on the club website. In April, there were 768 views (and 233 visitors).

Stan told the membership of a very generous donation of assorted R/C items from Mike D-. These items were then given to John Blossick for a potential meeting raffle prize or any other club use he determines. Proceeds will benefit the club. The membership gave Mike a round of applause in appreciation of his gift to the club. In addition to Mike's donation. Stan noted that two 40-sized trainers were recently donated to NCRCC through our website's 'Contact

Us' feature.

Stan announced that our June meeting will be held at the flying field in Ellington and begin at 6:00 PM. Members should monitor the club website for updates.

Treasurer's Report:

Len Marchese reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of April with the members. He noted that to date we had used 14.9% of the 2022 operating budget.

Len explained to the members the three budgetary components - the operating budget, the reserve budget, and the capital budget. Each of these are funded for unique purposes and these budgets are not intermingled. The operating budget is intended to cover day-to-day club expenses; it is funded by membership dues. The reserve budget is intended to cover sizable unknown future expenses that may occur over a given period such as repairing significant storm damage or replacing a lawn tractor that cannot be repaired; it functions in a manner similar to a "rainy day fund". The capital budget is intended to cover planned

major project work to improve the flying field such as the building of the pavilion or laying of the paved runway.

Len reported that the Audit Committee conducted a review of the 2021 books and concluded that our finances were in order. The Audit Committee consisted of Irv T-, Lloyd B-, and Dave A-. A written report from the committee attesting to the club's checking and savings accounts being proper and accounted for has been provided to the Secretary in accordance with our bylaws.

Activities Director Report:

Peter Tani noted that the building contest underway tonight was the first event of 2022. He extended his appreciation to Ed P- for running the event and to those who assisted and judged. Peter also thanked the members who brought models for the event.

Peter noted that the next club event will be the work day to prepare our flying field for 2022. He deferred to Art Usher for more detailed information when Art gives his report.

Newsletter Editor, Peter thanked those who have provided contributions for the club newsletter. Joan Liska (AMA District 1 AVP) who attended the meeting as a guest commented on the fine quality and content of NCRCC's newsletter.

Peter gave a short summary of his attendance at a recent AMA District 1 Zoom meeting run by Andy Argenio (AMA District 1 VP) and Darren Hudson (AMA District 1 AVP). A number of topics were covered. Joan Liska noted that the AMA is trying real hard to improve communication with its members and the Zoom meeting is just one example.

Ed P- gave the membership a report of the winners from tonight's building contest event. He started by thanking the judges and those members bringing models for display. Ed announced the following winners:

Liaison Officer Report:

John Blossick reported that he has an electric J-3 Cub available as a raffle prize.

John asked for members to step forward and make reasonable offers on the donated items displayed. All proceeds will go to NCRCC.

<u>Field Marshall/Safety Officer</u> Report:

Art Usher announced that a work party will take place on 5/14/22 (with a rain date of 5/15/22) and asked all members to be there to help. He reviewed the long list of maintenance and repair tasks that are needed. Art also reviewed the list of tools/items he's asking members to bring along for the work party. Art noted that he's looking into the scope of repair work needed to the ramp over the brook.

Art reported that a number of complaints have been made to the Executive Committee associated with difficulty experienced with closing the main gate. He has looked at the gate and, because a repair would be beyond our level of

expertise, Art has invited a contractor to provide an estimate for either repairing or replacing the gate. Len Marchese noted that if a decision is made to repair or replace the gate, this expense will be made under the reserve budget because it would be categorized as a sizable unknown future expense. More to come on this topic once the estimate is provided.

Art noted that Eversource has a project underway to update some structures but that those updates ought not impact our flying field based on his discussion with the Eversource contact. Art asked this contact if brightly colored warning balls could be mounted to the high power lines bordering our property but that request was declined.

Art spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low flybys/flight direction, following the established traffic pattern, and doing all flying in front of the pilot stations.

Art reported that the contractor he hired repaired two large cracks on our paved runway. A decision was made not to coat

the runway with sealant because there is no structural benefit – only cosmetic.

New Members:

Gene Paulson, Darrell Vliegenthardt, and John Messenger introduced themselves as prospective members.

Old Business:

Bob LaFlamme asked that the ad hoc committee charged with recommending a 3-year plan provide an update. Joel L- advised that the ad hoc committee recently called a meeting during which Joel was identified as chairman. Based

upon the meeting (and informal conversations held with select members prior to the meeting), a list of potential ideas was prepared and given to the Executive Committee for review. Joel asked for any other ideas and, hearing none, reported that his committee has completed its work and will cease to exist.

New Business:

Bob LaFlamme spoke about the possible creation of a

hospitality committee. This committee would be responsible for food served at club meetings. More specifically, the hospitality committee would purchase food/supplies, refrigerate/store the food until the meeting, bring the food/supplies to the flying field, move the grill and supplies from storage, prepare and cook the food, serve it to members and guests, return the grill and unused supplies to storage, and clean up following the meal. Bob asked for volunteers to staff the committee. Thus far, one

There is no new information to report on publishing of the final FAA Advisory Circular AC 91-57C, Exception for Limited Recreational Operations of Unmanned Aircraft, or status of AMA application to become a CBO.

The only new information on FRIA application is from the AMA Government Blog, which says: "Currently, the process to apply for FRIA status is not set to begin until September 2022 at the earliest."

This seems to indicate there will be a delay in applying for FRIA status.
