NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes -**August 11, 2022**

he meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by President Bob LaFlamme. The meeting was held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington, CT. In deference to a situation that occurred at the flying field shortly before the meeting began, Bob explained that we will sequence tonight's agenda differently than our routine method.

Bob asked for any corrections to the July meeting minutes as they appeared in the newsletter. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the July 2022 meeting minutes.

President's Report:

Bob LaFlamme welcomed the

membership and thanked Len Marchese and the members who helped set up tonight's barbeque, served it, and cleaned up afterwards.

Bob reviewed with the membership the goals he laid out for 2022.

NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – August 11, 2022 continued

Vice President's Report:

Mike Maznicki reported that we have one applicant who is eligible for a membership vote tonight. Mike noted that he has two other applicants pending.

Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 193 members. There were 30 members and 4 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included Darrell Vliegenthardt, Owen Green, Stacey Niezabitowski, and Alene Lang.

Stan gave a report on the club website. In July, there were 1,005 views (and 312 visitors).

Stan announced that our September meeting will be held at the flying field in Ellington and begin at 6:00 PM. Food will be served between 5:00 – 5:45 PM. Members should monitor the club website for updates.

Treasurer's Report:

Len Marchese reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of July with the members. He noted that to date we had used ~53% of the 2022 operating budget.

Len thanked NEPRO for their donation to NCRCC.

Activities Director Report:

Peter Tani thanked John W- for his newsletter article submission providing the latest update on the FAA's involvement with our hobby. John noted that he wrote that article while attending the Oshkosh fly-in.

Peter acknowledged the recent pylon race and reviewed the upcoming events on the 2022 NCRCC calendar. He noted the Warbirds event on 9/17/22 and the Tailgate Swap Meet on 10/8/22. When asked, Peter confirmed that flying would be allowed to active AMA members making a purchase during the swap meet.

Joel L- gave a Contest Director report for the recent pylon race event. Joel thanked the many volunteers that assisted with set-up, take-down, cooking, photo taking, announcing, trash removal, etc. The 424 competition had 12 pilots and the 426 competition had 7. NCRCC members faired very well in both classes. Joel reported that NEPRO gave NCRCC a generous gift. The members present offered their applause in appreciation.

Liaison Officer Report:

John Blossick announced the raffle prize for the night (electric R/C kit).

An announcement was made that the club has tee-shirts and hats emblazoned with the Dawn Patrol event available for sale.

John also spoke about the Make-An-Offer Marketplace which is composed of assorted hobby items from member donations. John invited the members to check out the merchandise and to see him with any interest. All proceeds will benefit NCRCC.

Field Marshall/Safety Officer Report:

Art Usher thanked the volunteer mowing team for the excellent job they are performing for the benefit of all members and guests.

Art spoke about the work that was done to repair the main gate and acknowledged Ed P- for leading the initiative. Ed and his helpers dug around the gate post, straightened it, added some concrete around the footing. and then backfilled it with dirt. Art added a stop to hold the gate while it is in the open position and has re-painted the gate bright yellow. Art spoke about steps all members should take to best maintain the integrity of the gate.

Art reported that, based on a request, he will build and weld a canopy on the zero-turn mower to provide sun protection for the driver. This

project will likely be done over the next few months.

Art spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low flybys/flight direction, following the established traffic pattern, and doing all flying in front of the pilot stations. Art noted that he witnessed some members taxiing from the pilot stations to the pit area and reminded all that that is unacceptable. Pilots are to carry back their models from the flight stations.

New Members:

Mike Maznicki presented Darrel Vliengenthardt for NCRCC membership. The membership voted in favor of Darrell's application.

Old Business:

Bob LaFlamme gave a brief follow-up regarding the development of a three-year action plan. He noted that the PowerPoint presentation was posted on the club's website. Work is underway to develop a voting capability. Keith Casked if the list posted represents the order of priority to which Bob responded that we will first take the membership poll and then apply weighting to ultimately back into the order of priority.

Bob M- spoke about his idea to host a Try-N-Fly event with

flight school basics, access to flight simulators, buddy-box assisted stick time for an in-flight experience, food, etc. The plan is to have this event in May 2023. Posters will be hung in local schools, restaurants, etc. to entice participation.

New Business:

Bob LaFlamme spoke about the need to form a Hospitality Committee. He noted that Len Marchese has been handling the purchasing, set-up, cooking, and clean-up for over 20 years and he is looking to find a replacement. Bob thanked those who have helped recently and asked for some members to step forward and volunteer for this committee. Please see Bob if you are willing and able.

Bob announced that he's appointed Stan Kulesa to chair the Nominating Committee. Stan is in need of 1 – 2 members to participate on the committee. Bob asked that those willing to serve on the committee or those willing to be nominated for a role on either the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors to please see Stan.

Bob asked for volunteers to create an ad hoc committee to plan and host a Neighbor Appreciation Day event at our field in 2023.

John P- announced that he crashed a pattern aircraft into a tree at the north end and recovered it a few days later. Someone left the remains under the pavilion. Regrettably, it appears somebody took the receiver and switch from the model

without John's permission.

Announcements:

No report.

Show & Tell:

Peter Tani showed a FAI racing team shirt he had won as a raffle prize and reported that two other NCRCC members won raffle prizes. One of those other winners (Dennis T-) gave his prize (R/C pylon racer kit) to Leo N- with the condition that he fly the model.

Leo N- gave a presentation on his recent pylon racing endeavors at the Nats and Worlds in Muncie, IN. He brought along the F3D FAI aircraft he used to set a world record. This models flies ~230 mph. Leo spoke about the course he flew, his techniques, and about his past experiences. Along with the world record he set, he earned multiple other awards for placing in individual and team competitions in 2022. Leo is now the Junior World Champion (and has the FAI medal to prove it).

Bob O- presented a Das Ugly Stick that he scratch built. He listed a number of the modifications he made including construction methods, airfoil, etc. It's powered by a Saito 82 four-stroke. Unlike most Ugly Sticks with a red finish, Bob opted to finish his with a blue/yellow scheme reflective of American trainer aircraft pre-WWII.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:14 PM.

NCRCC September 2022 Newsletter, FAA

Nothing has happened regarding the FAA-Recognized Identification Area (FRIA) since the last newsletter. There have been some Remote ID developments, but they will not affect us until September 2023.

The FRIA process was to begin in September 2022, but that's very unlikely because the FAA Advisory Circular needed to define the Community Based Organization (CBO) as well as the process for becoming a CBO has not been published. CBOs must be established (for us, the AMA) before the FRIA process can begin. So, we are still in a holding pattern with regards to a FRIA for the NCRCC field.

One item of interest to NCRCC members are changes to the FAA UAS registration and renewal process. The process has been revised to be compliant with the Remote ID requirement that will be in effect in September 2023, and in doing so, has become a bit confusing. As some members who tried to register or renew within the last year or so have found, the process now requires you to add at least one model aircraft to continue and complete the registration or renewal process. For those having difficulty, the AMA has a step-by-step procedure for completing the renewal or registration at the link here:

As of September 16th of this year, all Ready To Fly (RTF) model aircraft and drones weighing more than 250 grams must be manufactured with a Standard Remote ID built-in to both the model aircraft and transmitter. However, the FAA published the <u>Accepted Means of Compliance (MOC)</u>: Remote Identification of <u>Unmanned Aircraft</u> only a few weeks ago. It's unclear how manufacturers can design, manufacture, and ship compliant RTF model aircraft within the very short time remaining. There are some rumors that the September date for manufacturer compliance will be pushed out, but no details at this time. For more information on the MOC, see the AMA Government Blog here:

The Standard Remote ID rule won't affect most of us who fly other than RTF model aircraft at our club field. Model aircraft other than RTF (PNP, kits, existing model aircraft) will use a Remote ID Broadcast Module. Compliance with this requirement is a year out, in September 2023. We will not need a Remote ID Broadcast Module if we fly at the NCRCC field, once the field has been established as a FRIA.
