# NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – 9/14/2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by President Mike Maznicki. The meeting was held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington, CT.

Mike welcomed the membership.

Mike asked for any corrections to the August meeting minutes as they appeared in the newsletter sent 9/1/23. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the August 2023 meeting minutes.

#### President's Report:

Mike Maznicki gave a shoutout to Rob Hebert and his team of volunteers for running tonight's barbeque. The members offered a round of applause in appreciation. Mike also thanked Ed Case for publishing another great issue of the newsletter.

Mike reported that progress is being made concerning NCRCC's application to be recognized as an AMA Leader Club with a gold status. He explained what AMA Leader Club status means to NCRCC. Mike then spoke about some of the specific steps that must be taken to finalize our application. Bob Spooner graciously offered to cover the cost of an annual subscription to *Model Aviation* magazine to the Ellington Public Library.

Vice President's Report: Dave Arzt gave an update concerning FAA-related news. He noted that the requirement for models to be equipped with a remote identification device (RID) was recently extended to 3/16/24. Part of the reason for this extension was driven by the availability of RIDs. He mentioned that RIDs meeting FAA requirements are becoming more available and being sold by several manufacturers. Dave reiterated that a RID will not be needed for those pilots flying within NCRCC's FRIAapproved area around our flying field in Ellington.

#### Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 190 members. There were 40 members and 10 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included

Philip Prior, Robert Cocker, Brian Peters, Alene Lang, Stacy Niezabitowski, Ray Guidone, Asher Guidone, Pheonix Guidone, Evolet Guidone, and Lirit Guidone.

Stan gave a report regarding the club website. In August, there were 1,271 views (and 351 visitors). He encouraged members to periodically check the website's main page for important club news. Stan reminded the members that the password to access the 'Members Only' section is the same as the gate combination.

Stan announced that the October meeting will be held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington on 10/12/23 and that it will begin at 6:00 PM. The barbeque will begin at 5:00 PM. Sunset on that date is at 6:21 PM so we will have lights.

Stan reported that NCRCC's application to restore its taxexempt status with the IRS remains pending. When we submitted our application in March 2023, the estimated processing time was targeted to be 4 – 6 months.

Stan thanked Don Weight for his extremely generous donation of R/C models and

equipment to NCRCC. The proceeds from the sale of Don's donated items will benefit NCRCC. Don had been a member of NCRCC years earlier.

#### <u>Treasurer's Report</u>:

Len reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of August 2023 with the members. He noted that we had used ~57.5% of the 2023 operating budget to date.

Len announced that he is beginning work on the 2024 budget and asked the members if they had any potential projects needing budgetary funding. None were offered. Len requested that any member who has such a project funding need to send him an email as soon as possible. Len reminded the members that the finalized 2024 operating budget is contingent upon the actual dollar amount raised from 2024 membership renewal dues.

Len announced that the 2024 membership renewal campaign will be launched on 11/1/23 with the mailing and emailing of the materials to our current members. He reminded all that, due to marked increases in our

expenses such as the grub control application, the proposed re-seeding, potential maintenance fertilizing applications, fuel costs, etc., NCRCC membership dues will be changing to \$85.00/year for an Open Membership or Social Membership and that the dues for a Family Membership will be \$128.00/year. Dues for a Junior Membership will remain at \$12.00/year.

Len reported that he had received a request from the Ellington Volunteer Fire Department for a donation. There was consensus among the members to make a donation and some additional discussion regarding the dollar amount. With the authorization from the membership, Len said he would make a donation on behalf of NCRCC.

## Activities Director Report: Peter Tani reported on upcoming events.

Peter noted that, due to the close passing of Hurricane Lee, the Warbirds over Ellington event will be held on Sunday (9/17/23), not Saturday. He asked John Blossick (Contest Director) to speak about the event and John complied with an overview of what's planned.

Peter announced that the club will be initiating a "speakers series" for our meetings held at the Somers Public Library. Various members will give be invited to give presentations on a range of topics such as scale building, seaplane flying, competing at Top Gun, etc.

Liaison Officer Report:
John Blossick announced the items he's offering as tonight's raffle prizes. He had a small electric model and a 40-sized Citabria as prizes.

### <u>Field Marshall/Safety Officer</u> <u>Report</u>:

Bob Viering thanked the volunteer mowing crew for an awesome job maintaining the field.

Bob reported that he is working on the new information board, the new signage segregating the pit area from the spectator area, the two new signs identifying NCRCC for our field's entrance and the beginning of Green Rd., and the 'No Trespassing' sign for the main gate when it's in a closed position.

Bob asked if anyone has an outdoor patio dining set that they would be willing to donate to contact him. He might be able to arrange for a pick-up.

Bob thanked Buddy Beaudoin, Joel Lang, and Ralph Rinaldi for their work in creating a formal proposal for re-seeding the flying field between the parking area wooden fence and the windsock area. He invited Buddy to give the presentation on the proposed project. Buddy noted that the area for reseeding is approximately 70,000 sq. ft. and that to save money, we would purchase an aerator and seed spreader so that, as needed, re-seeding could be repeated over subsequent flying seasons. He described the volume of grass seed and starter fertilizer that would

be needed. Buddy noted that the grass seed is specially formulated for hot and dry conditions. A group of NCRCC volunteers would arrange to spread the seed and fertilizer. Buddy spoke about the pricing associated with the project and answered multiple questions. Buddy made a motion to authorize the funding of an expense of up to \$2,000.00 for this project. The motion was seconded and approved by the membership. The work associated with this project will begin immediately after the Warbirds over Ellington event.

Bob reviewed the AMA
Safety Code with the
members. He noted that the
new information board will
have the AMA Safety Code
posted on it along with
NCRCC club rules. Bob asked
all members to read and to
adhere to these safetydriven documents.

Bob pleaded with members not to fly alone. He strongly recommended always having at least two adults present while flying. Because of the remoteness of the flying field, the safety risk is mitigated when there is more than one person

present and able to react to emergency situations. Bob repeated the slogan, "Fly with a friend".

Bob spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low fly-bys/flight direction, following the established traffic pattern, doing all flying in front of the berm by the pilot stations, and loudly announcing when walking onto the runway area.

#### New Members:

Guidone, Pheonix Guidone,

Junior Membership. Each of
their applications for
membership were voted on
and approved.

#### Old Business:

There was no old business.

#### **New Business:**

Mike Maznicki announced that he is appointing Stan Kulesa as Chairman of the Nominating Committee. The nomination process for club officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Field Manager/Safety Officer, Activities Director, and Liaison Officer) will begin shortly. Members of the Board of Directors are not up for re-election this year.

Mike spoke about the AMA Introductory Pilot Program. NCRCC has been a participant in this program for several years. Most recently, we had four youngsters who had attended our Try-N-Fly event in August engage the hobby through this program. Mike noted that while the program provides key administrative protections, a temporary AMA number is assigned. As a requisite for club membership, NCRCC requires AMA membership for those applicants seeking flying privileges. The membership agreed that we would enable an applicant under the AMA Introductory Pilot Program to join NCRCC while their temporary AMA number is in effect.

Mark Nowak raised a concern about the NCRCC membership application process. He felt that the two meeting requirement for prospective new members was burdensome. There was some discussion and a clarification regarding an applicant's ability to fly was articulated. No change to our process will be made.

Mike Maznicki announced that the Ellington Public Library is willing to host a static display of R/C aircraft again. A few years ago, NCRCC made such a display during the winter months and we received positive feedback. The library also offered to allow NCRCC to use their conference room to give presentations on aeromodelling. Mike asked for a volunteer to step up and coordinate this with the library on behalf of NCRCC.



FRIA and Remote ID
Update

The FAA has delayed enforcement of the Remote ID requirement by six months to 16 March 2024 due to unavailability of Remote ID Broadcast Modules and many pending FAA FRIA applications. The FAA Policy on Remote ID Enforcement states:

Drone pilots are expected to comply with the September
16, 2023, compliance date for Remote ID. However, the FAA understands that some drone pilots may not be able to comply because of limited availability of broadcast modules and lack of approved FAA-Recognized Identification Areas. In those instances, the FAA will consider all factors in determining whether to take

<u>enforcement action through</u> <u>March 16, 2024.</u>

Keep in mind that even though we will not need to equip our models with Remote ID when flying at the NCRCC field, individual pilots are still required to have their Small UAS Certificate of Registration and TRUST Completion Certificate with them, and models weighing more than .55 pounds (250 grams) must display the pilot's UAS CERTIFICATE NUMBER.

There is no news on our Secondary FRIA at Crystal Lake. It's likely the AMA has their hands full with primary FRIA approvals for many

AMA clubs. Our Crystal Lake FRIA will not be needed until we begin flying on the lake next year.
