of the NCRCC Holiday Party on 12/14/23, club officer reports, etc.

NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – 11/9/2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 PM by President Mike Maznicki. The meeting was held at the Somers Public Library in Somers, CT.

Mike welcomed the membership. He announced that this is our final business meeting of 2023. The event scheduled for December is a party, not a business meeting.

Mike asked for any corrections to the October meeting minutes as they appeared in the newsletter sent 11/1/23. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the October 2023 meeting minutes.

President's Report:

Mike Maznicki noted that tonight we are celebrating our designation as an AMA Gold Leader Club. He called attendees' attention to the

sheet cake, plaque, plate, letter, etc. on the table near the entrance. Furthermore, the AMA awarded NCRCC as Club of the Month in November 2023. Lots to celebrate.

Mike announced that Irv Thurrott had agreed to temporarily serve as Activities Director while Peter Tani recovers from his injury.

Mike offered a special shoutout to Ed Case for publishing another great newsletter.

Mike recognized Irv Thurrott, Lloyd Burnham, Kevin Cyr, Dave Arzt, and Neal Caplan for their incredible kindness in tending to Peter Tani since his injury. Details on the extraordinary work performed by this group were noted.

Vice President's Report:

Dave Arzt spoke about a recent visit he and Peter Tani hosted at Crystal Lake in Ellington with the Guidone family where they got a chance to showcase R/C seaplane flying. Lots of great information was provided along with a ride on Dave's boat.

Peter Tani used the opportunity to award solo certificates to two members of the Guidone family. He also recognized Kevin Cyr's role as instructor under the AMA Introductory Pilot Program along with thanking the contributions of equipment from multiple NCRCC members.

Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 197 members. There were 38 members and 5 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included Vinni Otsuki, Ray Murphy, Michael Booth, Annie Guidone, and Alene Lang.

Stan gave a report regarding the club website. In October, there were 1,284 views (and 395 visitors). He encouraged members to periodically check the website's main page for important club news. Stan reminded the members that the password to access the 'Members Only' section is the same as the gate combination.

Stan announced that the December "meeting" will be our annual Holiday Party and it will be held at the Somers Public Library in Somers on

12/14/23 and that it will begin at 6:00 PM.

Stan reported that the April 2024 meeting will not be on the typical second Thursday of the month because the Somers Public Library conference room will not be available. Instead, our meeting will be held on 4/4/24.

Stan reported that NCRCC's application to restore its taxexempt status with the IRS remains pending. When we submitted our application in March 2023, the estimated processing time was targeted to be 4 – 6 months.

Stan reported that Irv Thurrott had donated a sound meter to the club. The membership offered Irv its grateful applause.

Stan read a letter from Andy Argenio (AMA District 1 VP) congratulating NCRCC for being designated the AMA Club of the Month for November 2023 out of 2,400 clubs throughout the U.S. Andy also applauded NCRCC's recent designation as a Gold Leader Club, as one of only 10, so designated out of 140 clubs in District 1.

Treasurer's Report:

Len Marchese offered his congratulations to the membership for earning Gold Leader Club status and being designated Club of the Month.

Len reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of October 2023 with the members. He noted that we had used ~96% of the 2023 operating budget to date. Len projected that we will be running a deficit in 2023 once all outstanding invoices for that year are paid.

Len announced that the 2024 membership renewal campaign was recently launched. He asked all members to respond with their renewals as quickly as possible so that the 2024 operating budget can be determined.

Len announced that he is working on the 2024 operating budget and noted that it is contingent upon the actual dollar amount raised from 2024 membership renewal dues.

Activities Director Report: Peter Tani thanked the membership for their well wishes following his accident.

Peter reported that the Heli Harvest will take place on 11/11/23. He then invited Ola Nordell to speak about the Frozen Finger event planned for 1/1/24. In his past, Ola noted how this event created some competition for who would get the first flight of the year. He noted that warmer weather was a great concern because of potential damage to the parking area and/or flying field.

Irv Thurrott presented plans for the annual NCRCC Holiday Party at the Somers Library scheduled for 12/14/23.

Irv reported that he will soon be meeting with the head of Hall Memorial Library in Ellington to discuss and plan for a static display of R/C models along with possible additional amenities such as a presentation and simulator opportunities.

Irv noted that in reaction to two NCRCC events this past flying season where other geographically close clubs had conflicting events, steps will be taken to proactively reach out to these other clubs. Peter reported that he had informal conversations with members of the club in Hadley. Dennis Thibodeau stated that, in years past when he was the Contest Director, he would proactively call club leadership at several local clubs to discuss scheduling and that he never had a problem.

Peter Tani announced that Adam Gorman would be invited to deliver the next presentation of the "speakers series" for the January 2024 meeting held at the Somers Public Library. Tonight's speaker will be Mike Doran.

<u>Liaison Officer Report</u>: No report.

<u>Field Marshall/Safety Officer</u> Report:

Bob Viering thanked the volunteer mowing crew for an awesome job maintaining the field throughout 2023. The membership offered appreciative applause.

Bob reported that he is working with Tom Munsell to diagnose a problem with the zero-turn mower as it's smoking a lot when started.

The repair will need to be made by a professional and Bob is making that arrangement. Furthermore, Bob will get the tractor to Glen Schlude for its annual maintenance.

Bob mentioned that he's in talks to cut a few trees to the right of the landing approach. Nothing has been finalized.

Bob is planning to post a "No Trespassing" sign on the main gate. He will be dismantling and discarding an old portable toilet.

Bob pleaded with members not to fly alone. He strongly recommended always having at least two adults present while flying. Because of the remoteness of the flying field, the safety risk is mitigated when there is more than one person present and able to react to emergency situations. Bob repeated the slogan, "Fly with a friend".

Bob spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low fly-bys/flight

direction, following the established traffic pattern, doing all flying in front of the berm by the pilot stations, and loudly announcing when walking onto the runway area.

New Members:

Ray Murphy and Michael Booth presented themselves as prospective members.

Vinni Otsuki was presented for Open Membership. His applications for membership was voted on and approved.

Old Business:

Tom Munsell gave the report of the Nominating Committee. He announced that the following nominations have been made for one-year terms:

Tom pointed out that Stan Kulesa will likely not complete his one-year term in the office for which he's been nominated and that anyone interested in serving as Secretary should step forward. Tom also noted that we have a contested election for the office of Vice President. He reviewed with the membership the comprehensive steps and timeframes for the election process. A detailed email outlining the process and dates will be sent to the two nominees. Also, the election process, along with candidate statements, will appear in the December issue of the club newsletter. The election for the office of Vice President will take place between 12/4/23 -12/11/23.

Mike Maznicki thanked the membership for the work it's done to be recognized as an AMA Leader Club with a gold status. He gave a shout-out to Bob Spooner for personally covering the cost of a two-year subscription to *Model Aviation* magazine for the Somers Public Library.

New Business:

Larry Clark asked about the status of memorial plaques for some recently deceased members. Mike Maznicki explained that we have a moratorium on adding any new plaques until the club decides on its flying site memorial.

Buddy Beaudoin reported that a hunter recently showed up at our flying field to check his equipment. Mike Maznicki explained that the hunter was granted permission years earlier and that he doesn't hunt while flyers are at the field. Mike went on to note that the hunter also helps NCRCC by reporting things that seem to be out of place. Mike then said that if the members don't want the hunter on our property, a vote should be taken. Buddy noted that he didn't want the hunter to be stopped from using the field. Instead, he was raising concern over liability.

Announcements:

Tom Munsell gave a shoutout to our members who are veterans on this upcoming Veteran's Day.

Bob Spooner announced that indoor flying season has begun at the East Windsor

Dome on Fridays between 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM. The fee remains the same as last vear.

Dennis Thibodeau advised that there is a rumor that Hog Heaven Hobbies is closing. He went on to note that the rumor is not accurate. The hobby shop is not closing. Dennis also spoke about a flagpole he uses and how that might be a solution for the flying field in Ellington.

Speakers' Series:

Mike Doran gave an excellent presentation on his experience with piloting a commercial jet and how his professional experience translates into his aeromodelling experience. He fielded many questions and comments from the attendees.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:32 PM.

Ellington Library Exhibition

Some time ago, a very long time ago in 2004, NCRCC partnered with the Ellington Library for an exhibit of model aircraft to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of Flight.

NCRCC members graciously loaned approximately 30 aircraft to display for 8 weeks (about 2 months) during winter months. There were 12 giant scale, four models were hung in each of the 1st and second floor skylights with the rest of them scattered about the ceiling. It made an impressive display. Each model had a placard on the landing gear with information about the model and full-size aircraft (if applicable). There was a handout with pictures and more detailed info about each so patrons could walk around and identify them.

Not only was it a terrific way to educate people about

model aircraft and build community goodwill, but it also solved the winter storage problem for some...

When people came into the library, they were greeted by about a dozen smaller models hanging in the foyer, leading to an impressive array of giant-scale aircraft gently swaying in the breeze in the main hall.

During the 8 weeks (about 2 months) of the previous exhibition, I spent quite a few nights at the library answering questions and talking about the models. People were extremely impressed with the models.

For this exhibition, we were asked to present some weekend sessions, aka what was done at the try and fly. Flight simulators, demonstrations of aircraft operation control surfaces and some hands on with models would make a good impression. We envision four of these on Saturdays.

Right now, we have tentative commitments for 20 aircraft and are looking for more. We would like about 10-15 more including a few giant scale and a turbine or two.

The exhibit will be installed at the end of December or beginning of January and will run through the end of February. Dates are tentative at this point.
