State of the Club - 2023 Report

During the 1/11/24 general membership meeting, President Mike Maznicki gave the annual State of the Club report. These are the **highlights** of what NCRCC accomplished in 2023:

- NCRCC was designated a **Gold Leader Club** by the AMA. NCRCC is one of only 10 clubs out of 140 in District 1 to receive this designation.
- In November, NCRCC was selected as the **AMA Club of the Month**. There are ~2,400 clubs throughout the U.S. and we are very proud to have been selected for this honor.
- We started 2023 with **175** members. The vast majority of our members renewed.
- By December 2023, we had 198 members.
- The NCRCC flying site in Ellington received approval as a **FRIA** site (FAA-Recognized Identification Area). Special thanks to **John Watkins** for his work on this endeavor.
- We hosted **multiple events**, some of which were AMA-sanctioned:
 - Building Contest in May (Thanks, Ed Post!)
 - Spring Tailgate Swap Meet in May (Thanks, Buddy Beaudoin!)
 - Dawn Patrol in July (Thanks, Bob Boulais!)
 - Try-N-Fly event in August (Thanks, Bob Martin!)
 - Warbirds over Ellington in September (Thanks, John Blossick!)
 - Fall Tailgate Swap Meet in October (Thanks, Len Marchese and Mike Maznicki!)
 - Heli Harvest in November (Thanks, Mike Lewandowski!)
 - Throughout the year, several float flies occurred (Thanks, Dave Arzt!)
 - Holiday Party in December (Thanks, Irv Thurrott and Peter Tani!)
- NCRCC thrives when its members step up and volunteer.
 Thanks to all those who took it upon themselves throughout 2023 to make NCRCC a great club. I'd like to give special shout-outs to the following members who just went far "above and beyond" for the good of NCRCC:
- Our VOLUNTEER mowing team did an awesome job of maintaining our flying site all season. Special thanks to Mike Doran, Neal Caplan, John Palica, and Carl Alleman.

- Rob Hebert, John Messenger, and Mike Yezak for teaming up to host our pre-meeting barbeques and the barbeques at several events.
- Bob Viering, Buddy Beaudoin, and John Palica for spearheading major projects to apply grub control and re-seeding our flying field.
- Bob Spooner for coordinating our ability to fly indoors at the East Windsor Dome during the cold weather months.
- Bob Spooner also arranges for us to have coffee and donuts during our cold weather meetings at the library.
- Ed Case for taking over as Newsletter Editor in June and producing our monthly newsletter, the NCRCC Flyer.
- Lloyd Burnham, Irv Thurrott, Ralph Rinaldi, and Peter Tani for forming an aeromodelling partnership with three teams of students enrolled in an aviation-themed engineering course at Western New England University.
- Leo Nordell was selected as a member of Team USA representing us in the World
 Championship F3D FAI pylon racing and winning first place. Leo also earned a second-place silver medal for the Junior class. We are VERY proud of Leo.
- We had several changes to the Executive Committee in 2023.
 - Very, very special thanks to Bob LaFlamme for giving NCRCC many years of leadership as its President during a period of great growth of our club.
 - Art Usher stepped out of the Field Marshal/Safety Officer role and I thank him for his significant contributions.
 - Bob Viering stepped in as our new Field Marshal/Safety Officer.
 - Dave Arzt stepped in as our new Vice President.
 - John Blossick stepped out as our Liaison Officer at the end of his term. Thank you, John, for your contributions to making NCRCC work.
 - I'd like to take this opportunity to DEEPLY thank the Executive Committee for their collective leadership in helping NCRCC drive a successful 2023. The club owes the members of the Executive Committee a HUGE thank you for their EXTREME level of volunteerism and dedication. NCRCC would not have accomplished what it did without the hard work by the Executive Committee.
 - I'd also like to thank the **Board of Directors** for the wisdom and counsel they provided the Executive Committee and NCRCC this past year.
- The NCRCC website continues to effectively keep our membership informed, provides important updates and information, and offers our community insight into aeromodelling. Each month, it receives roughly a thousand views and hundreds of visitors.
- People continue to reach out to NCRCC using the 'Contact Us' feature on the club website and, among various inquiries/communications, make donations of models and equipment. The sale of these donated items led to cash that was added to our ability to improve the flying field and club
- We announced an increase in our dues effective 2024 the first increase in many years to cover growing expenses. NCRCC operated with a budget deficit in 2023.

- In coordination with National Model Aviation Day in August, NCRCC hosted its first **Try-N-Fly event** to introduce the hobby to youth and anyone else interested. This was a huge success.
- An ad hoc committee composed of Buddy Beaudoin, Art Usher, and Gino Palumbo worked on a
 project to cut down trees but the membership ended up not approving the project. Special
 thanks to the committee for their hard work.
- We experienced unusually harsh vandalism to our flying field facility in May. I'm pleased to report that we have not had a repeat to the acts of vandalism since.
- Following the vandalism in May, Bob Viering installed a new information board and a metal cabinet on the pavilion.
- Work continues with the IRS towards the restoration of NCRCC's tax exempt status.
- We needed to cancel our April meeting but held all other regularly-scheduled monthly meetings throughout 2023.
- At each meeting, Bob Viering continues to report on and stress the importance of safety at the flying field.
- NCRCC had a contested election for Vice President. We utilized electronic voting for the administration of this election. There were no challenges to any of the other nominations for the 2024 Executive Committee.
- NCRCC kicked off a "speakers' series" for its cold weather meetings at the library during which someone makes a special presentation on a key topic impacting our hobby.

In summary, I think you'll agree that NCRCC has had a very good 2023. You can clearly see the reason NCRCC was designated as a Gold Leader Club. We are all VERY fortunate to belong to a robust and thriving club.

At the beginning of 2023, we unveiled goals for the year. Here's a quick status on those goals:

- Restoring NCRCC's tax-exempt status (IN PROGRESSS)
- Obtaining approval for our FRIA zone through the AMA and FAA (ACCOMPLISHED)
- Completing appropriate projects from our 3-year plan (IN PROGRESS)
- Improving comradery among our members (IN PROGRESS)

We have a lot to do in 2024 and I look forward to another good year.

NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – 1/11/2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by President Mike Maznicki. The meeting was held at the Somers Public Library in Somers, CT.

Mike welcomed the membership and wished all a Happy New Year.

Mike asked for any corrections to the November meeting minutes as they appeared in the newsletter sent 12/1/23. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the November 2023 meeting minutes.

Mike asked for a motion to approve the election of the following non-contested 2024 club officer nominees:

- Bill Cranford –

A motion was made, seconded, and a vote to approve the election of these club officers passed without opposition.

Two members were nominated for the Vice President position resulting in a contested election. Members were invited to vote using an electronic ballot in early December. An ad hoc committee consisting of Tom Munsell, Bob LaFlamme, and Stan Kulesa was called upon to tally and report on the election results in accordance with the bylaws. Tom Munsell reported that 109 ballots were cast in the election; 34 cast their ballot for Dave Arzt and 75 cast their ballot for Buddy Beaudoin. Buddy Beaudoin

was declared the winner of the election for Vice President.

President's Report:

Mike Maznicki gave the membership the annual State of the Club presentation during which he identified NCRCC's accomplishments over 2023, provided key performance statistics, and recognized many for individual and team efforts that made NCRCC the club it is.

Mike announced that, in accordance with the by-laws, an Auditing Committee has been identified to review our financial books and to provide the Secretary with a report no later than the March meeting. Lloyd Burnham (Chairman), Irv Thurrott, and Tom Munsell are serving on the committee.

Vice President's Report: Buddy Beaudoin thanked those members who voted for him. He said he's happy to be in the position.

Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 198 members. Stan noted that since we are still in the process of finalizing the 2024

membership renewal campaign, the total number of members to be reported next month will significantly change based on those who opt to renew. There were 33 members and 6 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included Ray Murphy, Michael Booth, Robert Metzler, Zach Etschman, Steve Teerlink, and Alene Lang.

Stan announced that the following members have not renewed their AMA membership and, as such, have been informed that they do not have flying privileges at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington: Kenneth Drapeau, Raymond Fisck, Scott Norris, Colton Palumbo, and Paul Rottenberg.

Stan gave a report regarding the club website. In December, there were 821 views (and 270 visitors). He encouraged members to periodically check the website's main page for important club news. Stan reminded the members that the password to access the 'Members Only' section is the same as the gate combination. He announced that we would like to periodically change the

photo on the club website's main page and invited members with a good high-quality photo to submit it for consideration.

Stan announced that the February meeting will be held at the Somers Public Library in Somers on 2/8/24 and that it will begin at 7:00 PM. Stan reported that the April 2024 meeting will not be on the typical second Thursday of the month because the Somers Public Library conference room will not be available. Instead, our meeting will be held on 4/4/24.

Stan reported that NCRCC's application to restore its taxexempt status with the IRS remains pending. When we submitted our application in March 2023, the estimated processing time was targeted to be 4 – 6 months.

Stan reported that Mike
Doran had donated \$500.00
to NCRCC following his
liquidation of former
member Ken Burke's estate.
Mike took the lead on
organizing Ken's items,
planning and hosting a tag
sale, and publicizing it.

Stan reported that another university (UConn) has

reached out to NCRCC to request aeromodelling resource support for a team of undergraduate engineering students. Stan reminded the membership of the work a team from NCRCC previously performed in support of engineering students from Western New England University. Lloyd Burnham has agreed to take lead on this opportunity with UConn.

Stan gave a shout-out to Ed Case for volunteering to serve as Newsletter Editor and to Bob Spooner for volunteering to run tonight's coffee break.

Treasurer's Report:

Len Marchese reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of December 2023 with the members. He noted that we had used ~108.75% of the 2023 operating budget; we incurred a deficit for the year.

Len prepared a proposed 2024 operating budget. He reviewed each line item with the membership. Multiple questions were raised and addressed. A hand-count vote was taken and the 2024 operating budget proposal was approved unanimously.

Len announced that the 2024 membership renewal campaign would be coming to an end on 1/12/24. He asked all members who have not already renewed to do so as quickly as possible lest they pay the \$50.00 initiation fee for payments made beyond that date.

Peter gave an overview of the Heli Harvest that took place this past November. He offered praise to Mike Lewandowski for hosting an excellent event.

Peter reported that the Holiday Party held on 12/14/23 was attended by 71 members and guests. It was a terrific evening. The auction was a huge success. Ola Nordell provided a report on our first Frozen Finger Fun Fly. He began by stating that Green Rd. was in great shape. The event had 28 pilots registered. The field was not muddy so it was not damaged by the attendees. No crashes occurred. The registration fee covered coffee/donuts and a pizza luncheon. Ola did note that snow was missing from the event.

Ola gave a presentation on the topic of winter flying. He offered a number of tips including wearing gloves that have the fingers cut off, keeping batteries in your pocket to keep them warm, and many other tips. Ola explained unique equipment needs for winter flying and information about skis. It was a most enjoyable presentation.

Bob LaFlamme spoke about the NCRCC R/C static display that was set up at the library in Ellington. Multiple models ranging from indoor electrics to gas-powered giant scale to gliders to a turbine-powered jet have been hung from the ceiling. Each model has a number attached so that visitors to our website can find photos and descriptions on our website. Bob has

arranged to host two seminars at the library on 1/20/24 and 2/17/24 during which we will provide ground school, flight simulators, and Leo Nordell will give a presentation.

Peter Tani announced that Adam Gorman would be invited to deliver the next presentation of the "speakers' series" for the February 2024 meeting held at the Somers Public Library.

<u>Liaison Officer Report:</u>

Bill Cranford presented a 40sized seaplane he's offering as the raffle prize tonight. Bill noted that he replaced the engine.

<u>Field Marshall/Safety Officer</u> <u>Report</u>:

Bob Viering announced that Eversource will be pruning trees and shrubs near the power lines and that members must avoid flying over or near the work crews.

Bob pleaded with members not to fly alone. He strongly recommended always having at least two adults present while flying. Because of the remoteness of the flying field, the safety risk is mitigated when there is more than one person present and able to react to

emergency situations. Bob repeated the slogan, "Fly with a friend".

Bob spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low fly-bys/flight direction, following the established traffic pattern, doing all flying in front of the berm by the pilot stations, and loudly announcing when walking onto the runway area.

New Members:

Robert Metzler and Zach Etschman presented themselves as prospective members.

Ray Murphy and Michael Booth were presented for Open Membership. Both applications for membership were voted on and approved.

Old Business:

There was no old business.

New Business:

John Palica asked about having a fire pit at the flying field. Mike Maznicki explained that regulations from the Town of Ellington Fire Marshall present significant obstacles to making this possible.

Announcements:

Ed Post announced that a new judging score sheet has been prepared for the building contest scheduled for 5/9/24. He brought copies and made them available for members to take.

Dave Arzt noted that four float flies will be scheduled for 2024. He is waiting for the club in Thompson, CT to finalize their dates before Dave schedules the dates at Crystal Lake in Ellington. Dave noted that a remote identification device (RID) will be needed to fly at Crystal Lake.

Ken Gorton noted that the most recent issue of *Model Aviation* magazine has information about a special Medicare Advantage plan which, as one of its many attributes, will cover the cost of membership in the AMA.

Turns out NCRCC is sponsoring a display of model aircraft at the Hall Memorial Library located in Ellington, CT. Our exhibit started with its initial setup on Saturday January 6th with over twenty flying models. They were displayed in the copula on their first and second floors as well as throughout their entrance and main concourse. It is quite a sight and would certainly recommend a firsthand visit before Saturday, February 24, 2024, which will mark the conclusion of our display and this portion of our two-part event; display and two community invites to Hall Library.

Special thanks to event organizer and past NCRCC president Bob Laflamme for his great foresight of mind and present vision while leading this effort. Thanks to those that helped set up in

The aircraft themselves have from one to three wings that range from 12 to over 100 inches in length. They hail from many different modeling "venues"; racing, control line, indoor and outdoor electric, scale warbirds, glow sport planes, a turbine jet, and even an ornithopter that flies by flapping its wings. Each aircraft was given an identifying number, and our in-house Hall Library flier contains a "QR" code link to our website with details about each one. Here is the link:
