NCRCC General Membership Meeting Minutes – 6/13/2024

The meeting was called to order at 6:04 PM by President Mike Maznicki. The meeting was held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington, CT.

Mike asked for any corrections to the May meeting minutes as they appeared in the club newsletter sent 6/1/24. There were no corrections offered and a motion was made, seconded, and a vote approved the May 2024 meeting minutes.

President's Report:

Mike Maznicki thanked Rob Hebert and John Messenger for their great work in hosting tonight's barbeque. The membership offered their appreciation with a round of applause.

Mike thanked Ed Case for editing another great issue of the club newsletter.

Mike reminded the membership that we have set aside funds for projects and he asked that if anyone had any ideas to see a member of the Executive Committee.

Vice President's Report:
Buddy Beaudoin welcomed input from members concerning topics they would like to have discussed during an Executive Committee meeting.

Secretary's Report:

Stan Kulesa reported that NCRCC currently has a total of 185 members. There were 52 members and 15 guests attending tonight's meeting. Guests included Jim Fitzgerald, Padraigh Fitzgerald, Alan Godin, Jason Stone, George Sweatt, Thomas Tenerowicz, Chris Garrett, Claire Garrett, Emerson Garrett, Kyle Stone, Trevor Stone, Wyatt Cartabiano, Gary Lasneski, Ray Guidone, and Santiago Bustos.

Stan reported that NCRCC member Richard
Niezabitowski has not kept his membership with the AMA current and, as a result, has been told that he does not have flying privileges at NCRCC's flying field.

Stan gave a report regarding the club website. In May, there were 1,426 views (and 405 visitors). He encouraged members to periodically check the website's main page for important club news. Stan reminded the members that the password

to access the 'Members Only' section is the same as the gate combination. Stan announced that we would like to periodically change the photo on the club website's main page and invited members with a good high-quality photo to submit it for consideration.

Stan announced that the July meeting will be held at the NCRCC flying field in Ellington on 7/11/24 and that it will begin at 6:00 PM. A barbeque will take place at 5:00 PM.

Stan reported that NCRCC's application to restore its taxexempt status with the IRS has been approved and steps were underway for the Treasurer to file a 990-N return.

Stan reminded the membership that he planned to step down as Secretary. He announced that the Kevin Cyr has agreed to serve as Secretary and that the **Executive Committee** supports this arrangement. In accordance with the club by-laws, Stan made a motion that Kevin Cyr fill the vacancy of the Secretary position until the next election and that this change becomes effective on or before the 7/11/24 meeting. The motion was seconded and

the vote to carry the motion was nearly unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report:

Len Marchese reviewed club expenses, income, and balances for the month of May 2024 with the members. He noted that we have used ~22% of the 2024 operating budget.

Ron Vernier (Contest Director) reported on NCRCC's first Biplane Bash which took place on 6/8/24. There were 17 pilots registered and the flying conditions were rather breezy. Nonetheless, it was a good and fun event.

Dave Arzt (Contest Director) spoke about several upcoming float flies. He announced that remote identification devices will be

needed since Crystal Lake is not an approved FRIA site. A hot dog and beans lunch will be served to attendees. Those interested should contact Dave.

Ron Vernier announced that Dawn Patrol will be taking place on 7/13/24; the event is open to all aircraft from WWI through the Golden Age.

John Blossick announced that Warbirds over Ellington will be taking place on 9/14/24; the event is open to all military aircraft.

Ola Nordell announced that the Nats will be taking place next month in Muncie, IN; several NCRCC members are planning to compete in pylon racing.

Buddy Beaudoin announced that a jet rally in Plum Island, MA will be taking place this coming week.

Liaison Officer Report:

Bill Cranford presented an electric Cub as the prize he's offering for tonight's raffle and he invited the members present to purchase tickets. Pheonix Guidone won the raffle and then donated the Cub to the Garrett family (new applicants to NCRCC).

<u>Field Marshal/Safety Officer</u> Report:

Bob Viering reported that both, the field and the access road are in good condition.

Bob pointed to the new flagpole and thanked those that assisted with raising it.

Bob announced that he would be repairing several set-up tables. He found some wood in the storage containers and will be using it.

Bob reported that we had a recent accident that required medical attention when a member cut his forearm on a prop. Bob pleaded with members not to fly alone. He strongly recommended always having at least two adults present while flying. Because of the remoteness of the flying field, the safety risk is mitigated when there is more than one person present and able to react to emergency situations. Bob repeated the slogan, "Fly with a friend".

Bob spoke about practicing safety at our flying field. He asked all members and guests to follow all club and AMA rules with a focus on all flying from the pilot stations, loudly calling landings/take-offs/low fly-bys/flight direction, following the established traffic pattern, doing all flying in front of the berm by the pilot stations, and loudly announcing when walking onto the runway area.

One element of this legislation would enable model aircraft to operate up to 700' or within a defined ceiling based upon the flying field's location in relation to controlled airspace. announcement on how to obtain a 700' ceiling at the NCRCC flying field. Finally, John spoke about an issue being discussed concerning a RID manufacturer.

Walt Wosko asked about the status of the initiative to cut down trees to expand the flying area. Mike Maznicki explained that the membership voted down that project.

FAA, Airspace, FRIA, RID Update

There has not been anything terribly newsworthy regarding FAA/Registration/Remote ID/Enforcement over the past month. The **Government Accountability** Office (GAO) did publish a report that criticizes FAA implementation of Remote ID, namely that the FAA has not done a great job of educating and coordinating with law enforcement agencies. The report also states that a network Remote ID solution is needed to make Remote ID fully effective, which could possibly provide further rationale to implement network Remote ID. However, it is unlikely that the GAO report will have any immediate impact.

Currently, we are awaiting FAA/AMA direction with regards to requesting authorization for NCRCC to

permanently operate up to the floor of controlled airspace which is 700 feet above ground level at the club field.
