All cleanable items have been power washed and or scrubbed with baking soda, grill and utensils, tables chairs etc. He was able to repair the door latch and reinforce the mounting area

with steel plate. Thanked helpers Buddy B, Tom M, Bill C, and Bill G. Len M explained that the trailer contents is now up and running thanking helpers and mentioned emergency funds were used to replace items. A cabinet was destroyed, microphones and generator stolen, paper goods and coffee pot replaced. Len provided a complete list of items purchased noting \$1998.32 has been spent and this remains open as additional items not yet noticed missing may be needed. The generator has been replaced with a 3500w unit with 3 year warranty

They spent their time power washing and sanitizing the entire inside of the trailer, along with the grill, tables, coolers and chairs. This team and others moved the trailer offsite on Monday Labor Day and it was back on property the following Saturday. Just in time for our September meeting and Saturday's Warbird's Over Ellington that Saturday. Thank you! Financially, we are in good shape. The replacement of stolen items and replacement for upcoming events, was funded from our financial line item:

"Emergency Fund". This line item was established many

years ago for such issues that we just experienced.

battery is required to get this 14.6" wide 17.5" long little jet flying under the FAA's radar with a flying weight of well under 150 grams!



restrain planes when tuning
or adjusting engines/ radios,
don't taxi back to the pits.
An incident had occurred
where an unnamed person
had a gas plane run away
towards persons in pit area.



Thankfully no injuries took place.

Hello all. The field is looking great as always the mow team is doing a great job, thank you so much for all your hard work. As I'm sure most of you have heard, the food trailer was broken into over labor weekend. What a pain in the neck, many things were stolen and a lot of things destroyed by them setting off one of the fire extinguishers. As of that Monday when we noticed it, I received a lot of help from many members as I was off to get tools to put tires on it. Carl, Bill Glode, Len and Art usher all got things ready. Getting tires ready and prepping trailer for transport, thank you guys for all the help. Once I got it to my house, I received several texts from Buddy, Tom Munsell and Bill Cranford all of which showed up Tuesday afternoon where we took everything out of the trailer, power washed and scrubbing everything, tables, grill, chairs propane tanks, pots, pans, coffee machine and the whole inside of the trailer. Ceiling walls and floor thank you guys for all your help. That Thursday was our executive meeting which I

was hosting so it worked out well, we all put everything back into trailer. Thank you all for that help, every little bit helped that Saturday. I took the trailer to my place of employment and spent a good 4 hours working on fixing the side door which was destroyed. I straightened out as much as I could and bent some steel plating to reinforce the door and lock. I would like to thank Len, he did a lot of traveling that week replacing everything that was stolen or destroyed. I would like to thank Bob LaFlamme for meeting me at the field and testing the sound system due to it was thrown on the floor and damaged. We were lucky on that one, we only needed new microphone system which Bob changed and made sure it was working, so a huge thank you to all that helped though this nightmare. With all that being said, I have received 3 reports that the gate is not being closed and locked at night. Please if you are the last person leaving the field morning noon or night close and lock the #!%*"\$# gate thank you. Onto some safety items, there is no taxing towards the pits. Taxi your plane no more than 5 feet past the flight stations and kill your engines motors.

If you wish to tune your plane after flight, please turn it away from pit area so that if something goes awry the plane will head to the field and not the pit area. I am saying this because it was reported to me that this has happened recently, luckily the plane hit one of the stands in the pits and not any of the three members that were up there, thank god no one was hurt. Onto our regular safety topics: fly with a friend it is recommended always having at least 2 adults present when flying. All flying from pilot stations need to fly forward of the berm. Need to follow the traffic pattern, loudly call landings take offs and low Fly Bys flight direction announcing when you step out onto the runway and when it is clear thank you and happy flying.
