

Financially, we are in good shape. Operations expense for May are climbing as we are into the heavy flying season, along with welcoming new members to NCRCC.



#### **Activities Director**

NCRCC members Lloyd Burnham, Kevin Cyr, Ralph Rinaldi and Peter Tani mentored the Western New England University aviation engineering course "fundamentals of flight" for their consecutive and now

third year. We as a group attended 25 classes bridging engineering and modeling.

The class was divided into four teams of approximately seven undergraduate students each. Each team was required to demonstrate the minimum flight requirements. Points were awarded for the timeliness, and quality of several milestones. Thereafter was a competition for maximum speed.

The requirements this year were to fly at 23 mph with an additional one pound weight, and to demonstrate five continuous minutes of straight and level/ electric-powered flight. Thereafter to fly at the highest speed possible in both level flight and in level flight after a dive. Qualifying flights were completed in late April 2025. The winning team achieved 151 mph.

I found volunteering while mentoring students and working with industry experts turned professor extremely rewarding and thinking a "feather" in NCRCC's collective cap.

Meeting adjourned 6:42pm ←






# **SPRING SWAP MEET**
