

## 2/12/26 Membership Meeting Minutes

The meeting began at 6:33 pm.

38 members and 1 guest were in attendance.

The January meeting minutes were approved with no corrections.

### Presidents Report

Mike Maznicki began the meeting by asking if anyone had cramps, muscle cramps and to see Irv for advice. Irv Thurrott spoke of his experience of drinking tonic water with quinine to relieve leg cramps. Mike thanked the Garrett family for providing refreshments including brownies and cocktail franks during our meeting break. Mike thanked Wayne Gustafson our newsletter editor. Mike then asked if members were aware of the process NCRCC has in place to contact the town of Ellington explaining that Len our treasurer, has been the town contact with Ellington department of public works for the last 9-10 years. Members can contact the executive committee, and Len will contact the town as needed, our field marshal Bob Viering is our secondary or backup contact with the town, this avoids many people making repetitive requests. Infinity badges, do not discard your badge. As much fun as it was to collect a new badge each year it was costly and time consuming to produce each year. Badges are printed for new members and replacements if needed.

### VP/New Members Report

Buddy Beaudoin announced the town had plowed Green Rd and he had plowed the parking lot.

Michael McCaffrey and Adelin Paris submitted applications to join our club, Wyatt Cartabiano and Chris Sonsini attended their second meeting and were voted in as new members, welcome.

### Secretary Report

The AMA flying site improvement grant application was submitted February 1<sup>st</sup> requesting the maximum amount of \$3000 for our new mower. Grant awards will be announced in May. Our AMA leader club status was renewed for silver. In 2024 NCRCC received gold status before additional requirements were added. To reach gold we must host a charity event as our Try-N-Fly event is not on the schedule for this year. Also a leader member is required. Rick Bell in attendance announced he is a Leader member. Of the 123 clubs in District One only 8 have a leader status of gold or silver. Tom Munsell with assistant Dave Arzt have received the club financial books from Len to perform the yearly audit and will report their findings at a later meeting. Our next meeting is Thursday March 12th at 6:30pm at the Somers Public Library, 2 Vision Blvd Somers CT.

### Treasurers Report

Len Marchese by way of Zoom presented the January expense report with roughly 20% of our yearly budget spent. Once per year expenses such as AMA charter, Zoom renewal, and Allied Lawn Service were paid. State of CT business filing was paid for also, with another filing due later in the year for Green Road Aero Society (GRAS). Len asked if there were any questions. Rick Bell asked what the state fee was, Len responded it was for the business filing for NCRCC with the state of CT. Dennis Thibodeau asked how often we use Zoom, Len responded mostly when he is away and unable to attend in person, we have discussed allowing members to listen in on meetings through Zoom if unable to attend.

### Activity Director Report

Peter Tani spoke of club channels of communication highlighting the importance of NCRCC relationships with the town of Ellington who Len is the main contact with giving an example of if the Somers library is to be contacted that would be done through our Secretary Bill Cranford who schedules our meeting dates with the library. The East Windsor indoor flight season continues Fridays 1-3pm organized by Bob Spooner and Irv Thurrott this typically ends in early or late April, weather depending. Peter shared an AMA email received

asking to “share your story” urging members to write in if they have a good story to tell of their RC experiences. Glastonbury Modelers fly free flight indoors at the Highschool during winter months if you’re looking for something fun and exciting to check out, you’ll see some fascinating rubber powered models and free flight gliders, no radio control allowed.

Ron Vernier and Buddy Beaudoin have set a date for the Spring Swap Meet scheduled for May 2<sup>nd</sup>, with a seller’s fee of \$10. Ron added setup starts at 7am, sales begin early. Dawn Patrol is scheduled for 2 days for the second year in a row now, July 11 & 12 with a landing fee of \$15 per day or \$25 for both providing a discount for the two-day commitment. Contest Director Ron Vernier mentioned event food would need to be organized by the club and if food is to be sold, he would like to include this on the event poster. Warbirds over Ellington is sanctioned for September 12<sup>th</sup>. A discussion then began with membership of a potluck club picnic in August similar to last year’s NEPRO sponsored picnic. LT (Bob) Hughes mentioned cooking ¼ chickens with some side dishes. Mike suggested volunteers get together and organize this as a club only event.

### Field Supervisor Report

Bob Viering spoke of equipment servicing, the zero turn will get an oil change and greased by himself and Tom Munsell. Glen Schlude is to service our tractor. Plans for spring cleanup include cleaning and painting our containers, staining plane stations, and basic property clean up. Chris Garrett offered to assist in attaching our club owned brush hog to our tractor. Quoting prices for paint and stain was a bit of a shock at \$1375 for 20 gallons of grey rustoleum and 4 gallons of stain. A discussion of past container maintenance began with Bob LaFlamme stating the containers have not been painted in over 20 years. Top Coat, a type of rubberized paint was recommended for use on the roof. Funding this project will be discussed as it exceeds the current field budget, funding may need to be approved and sourced from the capital (field) fund. Safety rules were read aloud, stay safe at the field, please fly with a friend.

### Liaison Officer

Ray Murphy presented the raffle prize, a Top Flite P-47 with a huge honking O.S. on the nose. This model was donated by member Mark Henrie who stuffed a 1.60 two stroke in a .90 - 1.20 size airframe. One of our newest members, Chris Sonsini was the lucky winner, though I’m not sure luck was much of a factor. He bought a lot of tickets! Thank you Chris, enjoy and hang on tight!

Ray mentioned NCRCC stickers can be purchased from him. Club merchandise is available through our website under the “club apparel merchandise” page, also a link is included in the meeting reminder email you receive.

### New/old Business

Rick Bell presented a show and tell of a 70’s style pattern ship he is building from a balsa kit. The model was nearly ready for covering with plans of powering with new technology including an electric motor from Innov8tive designs with a 6s lipo battery.

Buddy Beaudoin announced RC Madness is willing to order nitro fuel. After the closing of Hog Heaven Hobbies finding nitro fuel locally is not easy. A minimum order of 8 cases would need to be prepaid. This would be 32 one-gallon jugs, this amount avoids hazardous shipping fees. Contact Buddy with your nitro fuel needs.

Ed Post spoke of the building contest planned for our May membership meeting providing an outline of the categories and different builder skill levels when entering a model in this fun contest.
